







The State of Maryland Be it remembered and it is hereby certified that the following Bond was received
 from &  and recorded on the 8th day of February, Anno Domini, 1858, to wit: —
 Daniel Johnson Know all men by these presents, that we Daniel Johnson, Wm S. McKins, Henry
 D. Salley, of Worcester County, are held and firmly bound unto the State of Maryland,
 in the full and just sum of \$350 Dollars Current money of the United States, to be paid to the said State or its
 certain attorney, to which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, Executors
 and administrators, in the whole and for the whole, jointly and severally firmly by these presents, sealed with
 our seals and dated this 17th day of December 1857. — Whereas the Commissioners of Worcester County, by virtue
 of a supplement to the act entitled an additional supplement to the act to regulate Ferries, have contracted with
 the said Daniel Johnson, to keep the Ferry over Fishing Creek from McKins Neck to Hoopers Island, and
 agree to allow the said Daniel Johnson, the sum of One Hundred and Twenty five Dollars, current money for
 the same. \$125.00. — Now the Condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above bound Daniel
 Johnson, shall faithfully and diligently keep the said Ferry over Fishing Creek from McKins Neck to Hoopers
 Island from day-light to day-light, from the first of January to the first of April 1858, and from an hour
 before to an hour after day-light, from the first of April, to the first of November 1858, and from the first
 of November to the first of January 1859, from day-light to day-light, commencing the first day of January
 1858, and ending twelve months thereafter, and shall keep constantly and in good order a scow that will
 safely carry three passengers and three Horses at one trip, with an able bodied and skillfull hand to attend
 the said Ferry, and shall not charge or receive any greater price for Services than what is allowed by law, then
 the above obligation to be void, otherwise of full force and virtue in law. —



 itick, in the full and just sum of Two Hundred Dollars Current money of Maryland, to be paid to the
 said County Commissioners, or to their certain Attorney, to the which payment well and truly to be made
 and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, Executors and administrators, in the whole and for the whole jointly
 and severally firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals and dated this thirty first day of October 1857. —
 Whereas, the County Commissioners for Worcester County, have contracted with the said James Smith & Levi
 O. Drawers, to keep Slaughter Creek Bridge Draw for the year of 1858, and agree to allow the said James
 Smith & Levi O. Drawers, the sum of ninety eight dollars Current money for the same. — Now the Condition of
 the above obligation is such, that if the above bound James Smith & Levi O. Drawers, shall well & faith-
 fully keep open the said Draw for Vessels to pass through from the dawn of day-light in the morning until
