

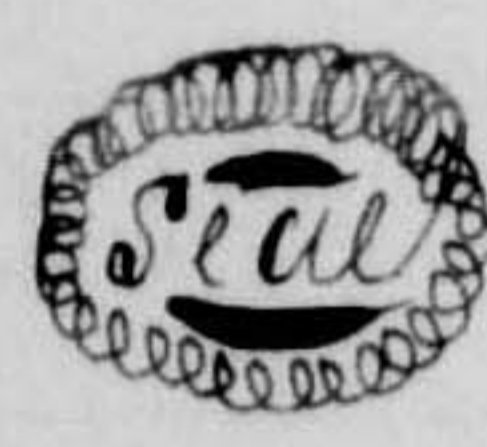

Dulaney, do hereby acknowledge, and themselves to be fully satisfied, contented and paid, have, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, release, except and confirm unto the Farmers and Merchants Steamboat Company of Nanticoke River, the hereinbefore mentioned and described Steamboat called the *Nent*, together with her engines, machinery, tackle, boats, apparel and furniture, to the said Farmers and Merchants Steamboat Company of Nanticoke River, to their only proper use and behoof, and to and for no other use, intent or purpose whatever. Mobray, of the same County & State aforesaid, do hereby bargain & sell to the said Alfred J. Mobray, the following property, 1 Sorel mare, 1 Colt, one year old, 1 yoke of oxen, 1 ox cart, 1 Cow, 1 Calf, 2 Hogs, 2 ploughs, 1 set of plough gear, 10 barrels of Corn, 800 pounds of Blade fodder, together with all my Household & Kitchen Furniture. — Witness my Hand & Seal this 29th day of March, 1858.
