Dowell, shall well and truly execute the office of Coroner in all things thereto belonging, and shall also well and faithfully execute and return all writs or other process to him directed, and shall also pay and deliver to the person or persons entitled to receive the same, all sums of money and tobacco, all goods and Chattels by him levied, seized or taken
