Dawson, of the County and State aforesaid, the receipt whereof, I do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained sold and delivered, and by these presents, do grant, bargain sell and deliver unto the said Saverus S. Dawson, my negro boy <sup>slaves for life which said slave Thomas,</sup> ~~Thomas~~, I well warrant and defend to the said Saverus S. Dawson, his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns, against me, my heirs, Executors and administrators, and against every other person or persons whomsoever. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal, this seventeenth day of July 1858.

Stevens, the said sum of Seventy five Dollars, with interest thereon on or before the first day of March next ensuing hereof, then these presents shall be void.
