Rawleigh, of Worcester County, in the State of Maryland, in Consideration of the sum of Four hundred Dollars, paid me by Samuel Higgins, of said County and State aforesaid, do hereby bargain and sell to the said Samuel Higgins, my following named negroes, Slaves for life viz Negro Woman Julia Ann, for the term of five years from the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty nine (1859) and all issue of the said negro Woman Julia Ann, during the said term of five years, to be and remain slaves for life, unto the said Samuel Higgins, also my negro boy Alexander, for the term of thirty three years from the first day of January, Eighteen hundred and fifty nine (1859) also my negro boy Watson, for the term of thirty nine years, from the first day of January, Eighteen hundred and fifty nine, (1859) and no longer, and I the said William W. Rawleigh, the said bargained and sold negroes viz, Woman Julia Ann, and her issue as aforesaid, and the said negro boy Alexander and Watson, unto the said Samuel Higgins, from & against all persons whomsoever shall and will warrant and defend by these presents. - Witness our
