And we the said Tubman Langford and Eliza Langford, for ourselves, our heirs, executors, administrators, all and singular the said property unto the said Edward Burford, his Executors, administrators and assigns, against us the said Tubman Langford and Eliza Langford, our executors and administrators, and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and well warrant and forever defend by these presents, of all and singular, which said property we the said Tubman Langford and Eliza Langford, have put the said Edward Burford, in full possession by delivering to him the said Edw.
