Collison, being entitled to said slave for the whole of said term, which said negro called Emily, was Manumitted by James Collison on the nineteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and forty seven, to be free on the twenty fifth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty eight, as appears by the Deed of Manumission, recorded in Liber W. J. No 3. folio 20, and of the Chattel Record Books for Dorchester County, reference being had to said Deed of Manumission, will more fully and at large appear. - Witness our hands and seals, this seventeenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and fifty eight.
