 years, on the 1st day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand
 and Eight hundred and fifty nine came into Court, and it being
 represented to the Court that the said John Human is not at service
 or learning a Trade or employed in the service of his parent or parents
 and that he is without means sufficient for his maintenance
 or support, and the Court being satisfied that said representation
 is true, and hearing also that it would be really conducive to the good of
 the said child that he should be put to learn some Trade or useful
 business, The said John Human is therefore on this thirteenth
 day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred
 and fifty nine bound as an apprentice by Alvernon Thomas
 Ladock Mossee and Levin Jones Justices for the Orphans
 Court of Dorchester County, unto Job W. Beckwith until
 he the said John Human shall arrive to the age of twenty
 one years, under the provisions of an act of the general
 Assembly of Maryland passed December Session 1839
 chapter 33, and the said Job W. Beckwith being here
 present in Court agrees to take the said John Human,
 as an apprentice until he shall arrive to the said age,
