 hammers, gear, axes, spades, shovels, axes, &c. One half of horsepower
 & whether the crop of wheat, growing upon the farm, where I now
 reside, & belonging to said Webster, all my household & kitchen
 furniture now in the house & kitchen on said farm, also one
 hundred barrels of corn, in the ear in the Corn House, and
 three thousand pounds of Pork, all of said property now being
 upon the Land & premises which I have ceded of said Webster
