David W. Tyler the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars with  
the interest thereon, on or before the fifth day of February Eighteen  
hundred and Sixty One, then these presents shall be void,  
Provided and in default of payment at the above specified  
time, the said David W. Tyler, may sell the above mortgaged  
negro man Moses Ennalls, by giving twenty day notice in some  
newspaper, published in Dorchester County of the time, place  
and terms of sale which shall be named, made, and deter-  
mined by the said David W. Tyler, and the money arising from  
said sale to be applied first to the payment of the expenses of  
said sale then to the payment of the sum of One hundred and  
fifty dollars with interest as specified in these presents  
or as much thereof as may be due at the time of such sale
