negro man Moses Eunalls, by giving twenty days notice in some
newspaper, published in Dorchester County of the time, place
and terms of sale which shall be named, made, and determined
by the said Daria W. Tyler, and the money arising from
said sale to be applied first to the payment of the expenses of
said sale then to the payment of the sum of One hundred and
fifty dollars with interest as specified in these presents
was much thereof as may be due at the time of such sale
