I. Mary Harley of Dorchester County and State of Maryland
on consideration of the sum of Two hundred Dollars Current money
paid me by Capt Edward C. Johnson resident of Dorchester
County and State of Maryland do hereby Bargain and sell to the
said Edward C. Johnson my negro man slave Green Pickett
for the full term of Five years from the first day of February last
past, the said Five years to be made up in full without deduction
or abatement of Six ~~days~~ or less time that is the said Boy is to make
up all lost time of sickness or otherwise so that he makes up
to Capt Edward C. Johnson the full service of Five years of
faithful labour, after which Service I do hereby Manumit and
Set Free, the said negro man Green Pickett of Bright-
Chesnut Colour, about five feet high, his freedom to come
and go from the end of his Service, and upon the Satisfaction
of the said Edward C. Johnson, Witness our hands & seals
