Bennett & Joshua P. Bennett, having purchased the same and are to have the sum of One hundred & forty dollars, for keeping said Ferry for the year 1859, Now the condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden Wm E. Bennett & Joshua P. Bennett, shall faithfully & diligently keep the said Ferry-
