 I, Thomas J. Dail Administrator of  
 William Waygate, Late of Dorchester County  
 State of Maryland in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred  
 Thirty Five Dollars paid me by Thomas Moore of Dorchester County  
 and State aforesaid do hereby bargain and sell to the said  
 Thomas Moore one negro boy Grander, to serve as a slave until  
 the first day of January 1880, also a negro girl called Margaut to serve  
 as a slave until she arrives at the age of thirty five, and then to be  
 free, said girl Margaut is supposed to be now between six and  
 Seven years old the said Negro having been sold by the said Thomas  
 J. Dail Administrator aforesaid by virtue of an order of the Or-  
 phans Court of Dorchester County passed on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of December  
 1858, and which said Negroes called Francis and Margaut are  
 the children of negrowoman called Jane, who was manumitted  
 by the said William Waygate on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1851 aforesaid  
 being had to the said Island of Manumission recorded in Liber  
 W. I. N. 3 folio 338, one of the Chattel Records of Dorchester will fully  
 appear, and the said Thomas J. Dail Administrator aforesaid  
 being entitled to said Negroes for the whole of the term hereinbefore  
 referred to witness our hands and seals this fourth day of Jan-  
 uary eighteen hundred and fifty nine

 hereby bargain and sell to the said George W. Warren, my indentured apprentice William Richard  
 Hawkins, to serve until the twelfth day of November, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty  
 three, the said negro boy, to serve until he attains the age of Twenty one years & no longer, and so
