Be it remembered and it is hereby certified
that the following Bill of Sale was received and
recorded the 5th day of January 1859 to wit
I, Thomas J. Dail Administrator of
Wm Weigate, Late of Dorchester County in the
State of Maryland in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred
Thirty Three Dollars paid me by Thomas Moore of Dorchester County
and State aforesaid, do hereby bargain and sell to the said
Thomas Moore one negro Boy Francis, to serve as a slave until
the first day of January 1880, also a negro girl called Maryaut to serve
as a slave until she arrives at the age of thirty five, and then to be
free, said girl Maryaut is supposed to be now between six and
seven years old the said Negro having been sold by the said Thomas
J. Dail Administrator aforesaid by virtue of an order of the Orphan
Court of Dorchester County passed on the 14th day of December
1858, and which said Negroes called Francis and Maryaut are
the children of negro woman called Jane, who was manumitted
by the said William Weigate on the 13th day of May 1851 reference
being had to the said Bill of Manumission recorded in Liber
W. J. N. 3 folio 338, one of the Chattel Records of Dorchester will fully
appear, and the said Thomas J. Dail Administrator aforesaid
being entitled to said Negroes, for the whole of the term herein before
referred to witness our hands and seals this fourth day of Jan
uary Eighteen hundred and fifty nine

three, the said negro boy, to serve until he attains the age of Twenty one years & no longer, and
