Hicks and John Webster, all of Dorchester County, in the State of Maryland, are held and firmly bound unto the State of Maryland, in the full and just sum of Twenty two thousand Dollars, current money, to be paid to the said State, or its certain attorney, to which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, and each of us, our and each of our heirs, Executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. — Sealed with our seals and dated this eleventh day of July, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine. — The condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above bound Josias S. Simmons, appointed Collector of the seventh Election District of Dorchester County, shall well and faithfully execute his office, and the several duties required of him by law, and shall well and truly account for, and pay to the County Commissioners of Dorchester County, on their order, the several sums of money which he shall receive, as he is answerable for by law, at such time as the law shall direct, then the above obligation to be void. —
