Be it remembered and it is hereby certified that the following Bill of Sale was received and recaded on the 31st day of October 1839. to wit

Recd. to W. C. Ch. of Court July 14 1860.

Whereas, I am indebted unto my father Jacob C. Nicholson for moneys at various times, and for various purposes by him advanced and loaned to me, or by him paid for my use, over and above all transfers and assignments, and sales of real and personal property heretofore made by me to him, in the full sum of Nine Thousand Dollars. And whereas my father hath agreed with me to accept the personal property herein after mentioned at fifteen hundred Dollars, I, Henry D. Nicholson of Goochesteer County State of Maryland in consideration of the sum of fifteen hundred dollars do hereby bargain and sell to the said Jacob C. Nicholson the following property: One horse called John Prince, One called Tom, One called Shellbark, One mare called Fanny, One small four wheeled buggy & harness, One sulky & harness, the crop of Corn & wheat now growing upon the land where I reside a lot of straw & fodder, One sail Canoe, sails & tackeling, One Can Shutter, eight hundred bushels of Lime, all my household & kitchen furniture, three Carts five Cows, two Calves, One yoke of oxen, twelve head of hogs, eight head of sheep, two thousand volumes of miscellaneous books, five sets of Cart gear, One seine & boat, a lot of Carpenters tools, the products of vegetable patch now growing, a lot of poultry, five beehives, a lot of plows, hammers, Cultivators & all the residue of my farming implements & other things which I have on or about the farm on which I reside
