due and owing by and from me to Tristram J. Martin and William P. Martin of  
Baltimore City in the State aforesaid, trading under the name of J. J. Martin and  
brother do hereby bargain and sell to the said Tristram J. Martin and William P. Martin  
trading under the name of J. J. Martin and brother, the following property, that is to say  
one grey mule aged about sixteen years, one black horse aged about fourteen years  
one bay horse aged about nine years, two black and white cows aged about six years,  
two red and white cows aged about four years, one red and white bull calf aged about  
one year, one dark red cow calf aged about one year, seven white shoats aged about eight  
months, one black and white sow, one white sow and seven pigs, two horse carts, five  
plows, one drag harrow, one seed harrow, two cultivators, one dubin and harness, five  
feather beds and bedding, three mattresses, one silver watch, five bedsteads, one  
dozen common chairs, one walnut table, one pine table, two stoves, one lounge  
one bannan, one grind-stone, two axes, one dozen hoes, & all my cart and plow harness, all  
the said herein described and mentioned property, being at this time in my possession  
and in the house or on the farm of the said Tristram J. Martin near the town of Cambridge  
in the County aforesaid, whereon I reside, also five hundred pounds of bacon in
