Gail administrator as aforesaid by virtue of an order of the Orphans Court of Orchester County passed on the 12th day of December 1858. said woman Jane was manumitted by the said William Wingate on the 15th day of May 1851 and the said Thomas J. Gail administrator as aforesaid being entitled to said woman called Jane and child Amelia for the time herein before referred to witness our hands and seals this third day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty
