Be it remembered and it is hereby certified that the following Bond was received and recorded on the 19th day of May Anno Domini 1860, to wit:

\$30,000.00 I know all men by these presents that Charles F. Goldsborough, Daniel M. Henry and Price J. Goldsborough of Chester County, in the State of Maryland are held and firmly bound unto the State of Maryland in the full and just sum of thirty thousand dollars, Current money, to be paid to the said State of Maryland or its certain attorney, to which payment well and truly to be made and done we bind ourselves and each of us, our and each of our heirs, executors and Administrators, jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this nineteenth day of May in the year eighteen hundred and sixty

Whereas, by two deeds, the one from Daniel Lloyd and wife to the said Charles F. Goldsborough, bearing date on the third day of October, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty seven, and recorded in Liber F. J. R. M. L. folios 81, 82 and 83, One of the Land record books of Chester County, and the other bearing date on the fifth day of October, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty seven, from James W. Henry and wife, Francis J. Henry and wife Thomas P. Steel and wife, Richard S. Goldsborough and wife, and Price J. Henry, to the said Charles F. Goldsborough, recorded in Liber F. J. R. M. L. folios 83, 84 & 85, one of the Land record books of Chester County certain real estate therein named was conveyed to the said Charles F. Goldsborough, in trust, for certain purposes mentioned in said deeds, Now the condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Charles F. Goldsborough do and shall well and faithfully perform the trust reposed in him by said deeds, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue in law
