Be it remembered and it is hereby certified that the following Manumission was received and recorded on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of May Anno Domini 1860 to wit:

I Jeremiah C. Wright of Dorchester County and State of Maryland do hereby manumit and set free my negro servants to commence at the date herein after specified, to wit, Stephen to commence the first day of January 1863, Anaminta to commence the first day of January 1873, John to commence the first day of January 1878, James to commence the first day of January 1880, Belia to commence the first day of January 1882, Charles to commence the first day of January 1886, Edward to commence the first day of January 1888, Hester to commence the first day of January 1890, Daniel Henry to commence the first day of January 1881. And if either of the above named Anaminta, Belia, or Hester shall have Issue before the commencement of their freedom, the male children shall be free at the age of 30 years and the Female children at the age of 25 years, Witness my hand and seal this 30<sup>th</sup> day of May 1860.
