Dunnoek his heirs and assigns forever, to his and their sole use and uses forever, and to and for no other use in tent or purpose whatsoever against me the said John R. Dunnoek and my heirs and against all persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. In Testimony whereof the said John R.
