Know all men by these presents that I Samuel R. Vinton of Worcester County and state of Maryland for and in Consideration of the sum of Thirty one Hundreds and fifty dollars Current money to me in hand paid by Anthony R. Wallace & James R. Stevens of the City of Baltimore in the said state, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, by these presents do give, grant bargain & sell alien transfer unto the said A. R. Wallace & James R. Stevens, their Executors administrators and assigns a new vessel on the stocks & nearly finished, at the shipyard on the Choptank River in the town of Cambridge, to be finished as a fore and aft schooner of the following dimensions to wit, Eighty nine feet six inches on deck in length, twenty three feet seven inches breadth of beam, & seven feet, seven inches depth of hold, and measuring tons, by Carpenters measurement - To Have and To Hold the said vessel, or hull of said vessel to the said A. R. Wallace & James R. Stevens, above bargained & sold, or intended so to be, their executors administrators and assigns forever, and I the said Samuel R. Vinton have put the said A. R. Wallace & James R. Stevens in full possession of said vessel, and I the said Samuel R. Vinton do Covenant & agree to & with the said A. R. Wallace & James R. Stevens, to finish & complete said vessel, & launch her according to our previous Contract.
