 bargained and sold unto the said Eliza A. Barnett and her heirs, executors, administrators, and
 assigns, against me, the said James A. Stewart my heirs, executors, and administrators, and
 against all and every other person or persons, shall and will warrant and defend. -

 whereof, I the said Richard Mitchell do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these
 presents do grant, bargain and sell, unto the said Francis J. Henry and Alexander H. Bayly, their Executors
 administrators and assigns, all the goods, household stuff, implements & furniture hereinafter
 particularly mentioned; that is to say; three small stacks of fodder, and ox Cart one Cow, four
 hogs, one gutstone, five hundred feet of white pine boards, three plows, two harrows, two beds, bedsteads
 furniture, two mahogany tables, one Doyen Chairs, one Canoe, and all the rest and residue of
 my household & kitchen furniture stock and farming implements of every kind whatsoever. To
 have and to hold the said goods, household stuff & furniture, and other the premises above
 bargained and sold, or mentioned, or intended so to be, to the said Francis J. Henry and Alexander H.
 Bayly their Executors, administrators and assigns, forever, and I the said Richard Mitchell for myself.
