in the State of Maryland, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Dollars  
Current money to me in hand, paid by Thomas Hubbard of the same County and State aforesaid, at or  
before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof I the said John Hicks North, do  
hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell  
unto the said Thomas Hubbard, his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns, One negro Woman named  
Eliza, aged about thirty years, as slave for life, sound in body and mind. To Have and To Hold,  
the said negro Woman Eliza, as above bargained and sold, unto the said Thomas Hubbard, his heirs,  
Executors, administrators, and assigns, against me the said John Hicks North, my heirs, executors,  
administrators and assigns, and against all and every other persons or persons whatsoever, shall  
and will usurant and forever defend. In Testimony Whereof, the said John Hicks North, hath  
hereunto subscribed his name, and affixed his seal, this twenty sixth day of October, in the  
year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty three.
