


 Know all men by these presents, that I, James Thompson Executor of Sarah Rawlidge late of Chester County, and State of Maryland, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred and Seventy Dollars, current money to me in hand paid by Robert Wrightson of Chester County and State of Maryland, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell, unto the said Robert Wrightson, his heirs and assigns, the following negro woman Betty, to serve until the last day of December, Eighteen Hundred and sixty five, agreeably to the last Will and Testament of Sarah Rawlidge, and the order of the Orphans Court Chester County, slave for the term aforesaid and send in body and mind. To Have and To Hold, the said negro Betty, until the last day of December, in the year Eighteen Hundred and sixty five, and then to be free according to the Conditions of the Will an order aforesaid, as above bargained and sold unto the said Robert Wrightson, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, against me the said James Thompson Executor of Sarah Rawlidge, her heirs, executors and administrators, and against all and every other persons or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend. In Testimony Whereof, I, James Thompson Executor, and J. Robert Wrightson, have hereto set our hands and affixed seals this 14th day of November, Eighteen Hundred and fifty three.
