David Hardican & Wife Know all men by these presents, that we David Hardican and Elizabeth Hardican his wife of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland, for and in Consideration of the sum of Five Hundred Dollars Current money of Maryland to us in hand paid by Arthur Pritchett Senr. of Dorchester County and State aforesaid, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof we the said David Hardican and Elizabeth his wife do hereby acknowledge, have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell, unto the said Arthur Pritchett Senr. his heirs, executors and administrators One negro Boy named Patrick aged about Eighteen years a Slave for life. To Have and to Hold the said negro Boy Patrick as above bargained and sold, or mentioned or intended so to be, to the said Arthur Pritchett Senr. his heirs Executors, administrators and assigns forever, and we the said David Hardican and Elizabeth his wife for ourselves our heirs executors and administrators, all and singular the said negro Boy Patrick unto the said Arthur Pritchett Senr. his executors administrators and assigns, against us the said David Hardican and Elizabeth his wife our Executors and administrators, and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents; In Testimony whereof, we David Hardican and Elizabeth Hardican his wife have hereunto subscribed our names and affixed our seals this Twenty seventh day of December Eighteen Hundred and fifty three -
