Provided always and these presents are upon this Condition that if the said Charles Austin his executors or administrators shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said John A. Scott his executors administrators or assigns the full sum of Five hundred dollars Current money with the interest thereon on or before the first day of January eighteen hundred and fifty five, then and in such Case these presents and every matter and thing herein contained shall cease determine and be utterly void to all intents and purposes any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding - In witness whereof the said Charles Austin free Colored man hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year first herein before written -
