Stewart of the following dimensions that is to say thirty four feet in length, eleven feet two inches in width and two feet two inches deep. I have and do hold the said Boat mentioned unto him the said Anthony O. Thompson his Executors administrators and assigns to his and their own use and behoof — Provided always and it is declared to be the true intent and meaning of these presents that if the said Spencer young do and shall well and truly pay one Peso to be paid unto the said Anthony O. Thompson his Executors administrators and assigns the full sum of Fifty Dollars Current money one thousand dollars day of July 1854 with legal interest thereon then and in such Case these presents and every matter and thing therein contained shall cease determine and be utterly void to all intents and purposes any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding — the testimony whereof the said Spencer young has hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above written

Sullivan of Dorchester County State of Maryland for divers good Causes and Considerations me thence moving have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free my negro William Giles who is able to work & gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and to the said William Giles I do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted & discharged from all manner of service or servitude to me myself, executors or administrators forever — In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 30th day of January 1854.
