

(2) THE LIABILITY OF THE FUND UNDER THE MARYLAND WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT IS LIMITED TO PROVIDING WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE COVERAGE AND SANCTIONS THAT RESULT FROM FAILURE TO DO SO.

(c) (1) The Commission shall levy an assessment against all licensed thoroughbred owners and trainers to provide sufficient funds to pay the cost of the insurance required by this section and [Article 101 of the Code] THE MARYLAND WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT.

(2) All assessments collected by the Commission under this section shall be transferred to the Fund and shall be used by the Fund to purchase the workmen's compensation insurance for jockeys and to administer the workmen's compensation program for jockeys required by this section and [Article 101 of the Code] THE MARYLAND WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT.

(d) The Fund shall be managed by a three-member board of directors who shall be appointed by, and serve at the pleasure of, the Secretary of Licensing and Regulation, and who shall post any bond required by the Secretary.

(e) The Fund shall have such authority as is necessary to implement the provisions of this section.

(f) The license of any owner or trainer who fails to pay the assessment levied pursuant to this section:

(1) Shall be revoked or suspended; and

(2) May not be reinstated or renewed during the period of the default.

REVISOR'S NOTE: Chapter ____, Acts of 1991, which enacted the Labor and Employment Article, also amended this section to add a new subsection (b)(1), which is derived without substantive change from former Art. 101, § 21(d)(4).

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(c) This section is applicable only to inspections sought pursuant to the following:

(1) Article 48, § 176 of the Boiler and Pressure Vessel Safety Act;

(2) [§§ 35 and 49B of this article relating to occupational safety;

(3) § 62 of the High-Voltage Line Act of this article] § 49B OF THIS ARTICLE RELATING TO ELEVATORS, DUMBWAITERS, ESCALATORS, AND MOVING WALKS; or

[(4)] (3) § 72 of this article relating to amusement park safety.
