(a) On or before July 1, 1988, the STATE WORKERS' COMPENSATION Commission shall adopt guides to be used by physicians to measure and report to the Commission all medical evaluations of permanent impairments, including loss of function, endurance, and range of motion, and pain, weakness, and atrophy.

(b) The guides to be adopted by the Commission under subsection (a) of this section are regulations under Subtitle 1, Title 10 of the State Government Article.

This section does not appear in the Code since the Workers' Compensation Commission has adopted the guides.

[(b) (1) The commissioners of the Injured Workers' Insurance Fund shall appoint a superintendent and an assistant superintendent to assist him in his duties, both of whom shall receive such salary as may be provided for in the budget.

(2) (i)] The [present] technical and professional personnel, as determined by the [commissioners] BOARD FOR THE INJURED WORKERS' INSURANCE FUND, who are employed in the operation of the Injured Workers' Insurance Fund, including the superintendent and assistant superintendent, shall be transferred to the agency [created and retain their rights and status under the classified service until July 1, 1991.

(ii) On July 1, 1991, all technical and professional employees shall be members of the unclassified service.

(3) All persons hired by the Fund on and after July 1, 1990, shall be members of the unclassified service.

(4) Future appointments of employees as are provided for in the budget shall be made by the commissioners and the appointees shall be members of the unclassified service.

(5) (i)] CREATED. Technical and professional employees who elect not to transfer to the unclassified service shall retain all rights and privileges of the [merit system] CLASSIFIED SERVICE until July 1, 1991.

[(ii)] The Fund shall establish a program for the retraining and placement of the technical and professional employees who choose not to transfer to the unclassified service before July 1, 1991, that shall include job training, counseling, and placement services for either a State position or a private sector position with comparable wages.
