

Article 88A – Social Services Administration

17A-2.

(g) (1) For the purpose of the [State Workmen's] MARYLAND WORKERS' Compensation [Law] ACT, participants in the following programs shall be considered employees of the Department of Human Resources while assigned to jobs:

(i) General public assistance to employables; and

(ii) Work experience programs administered as part of the Department's employment initiatives project.

(2) The Secretary of Human Resources shall pay into the Insured Workers; Insurance Fund the premium established by the fund as necessary to provide [workmen's] WORKERS' compensation for these individuals.

Article 88B – State Police

(e) (4) An off-duty police employee or airport police employee who voluntarily performs law-enforcement duties on State Aviation Administration property may not receive overtime compensation for the performance of those duties. In all other respects, overtime provisions for police employees and airport police employees shall be as provided in [§ 76 (d) of Article 100] ARTICLE 89, § 27(D) OF THE CODE.

(c) The Department shall provide uniforms and equipment necessary for the performance of the duties of all employees to the extent permitted by the budget. All uniforms and equipment shall be purchased by the Department in accordance with the provisions of [Article 21] THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE and shall remain the property of the State.

(e) Except as permitted by this article, TITLE 9 OR TITLE 10 OF THE LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT Article [101 (Workmen's Compensation)], or rule, no employee of the Department shall receive any money or other thing of value for any services performed by him as an employee of the Department or otherwise resulting from such employment. When an employee is permitted by the Superintendent to accept money or other thing of value, such shall be delivered to the Department and disposed of as provided by rule.

(c) Law enforcement and cadet participants in the alternative work schedule program will be exempt from the overtime compensation requirements of [§ 76(d)(1) of Article 100] ARTICLE 89, § 27(D)(1) OF THE CODE. Overtime compensation for law enforcement and cadet program participants shall be computed on a daily basis, by dividing the daily rate of compensation by the number of hours in the workday and multiplying the resulting quotient by one and one-half times the number of hours worked in excess of the alternative 10 hour workday.
