

(2) A resident in a facility as defined under § 10-101(e) of the Health - General article is not [an] A COVERED employee, AS DEFINED IN TITLE 9 OF THE LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT ARTICLE, of the employer for the purposes of workers' compensation [within the meaning of article 101, § 21 of the Code].

(a) (2) The provisions of [Article 100, § 76(a)] ARTICLE 89, § 27(A) of the Code, for compensation of State employees for work in excess of the normal workweek, do not apply to these nursing personnel. Unless ineligible to receive overtime compensation, any assigned work performed by nursing personnel in excess of 80 hours for the biweekly work period shall be compensated at one and one-half times the hourly rate established by dividing the biweekly compensation by 80.

(b) (2) The provisions of [Article 100, Section 76(a)] ARTICLE 89, § 27(A) of the Code, for compensation of State employees for work in excess of the normal workweek, do not apply to these employees.

(k) Except as provided in this section, the enactment of this section shall not be construed to make the provisions of the Maryland labor laws contained in [Article 89 and Article 100] TITLE 4, SUBTITLES 1, 2, AND 3 OF THE LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT ARTICLE applicable to employment at Montgomery Community College.

(a) The State Board of Education and the [Workmen's] STATE WORKERS' Compensation Commission shall administer jointly the program established in this section and § 21-306 of this subtitle.

(b) (3) The Chairman of the [Workmen's] STATE WORKERS' Compensation Commission and the Director of the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation are ex officio members.

(6) Each member of the Committee:

(i) Serves without compensation; and

(ii) Is entitled to reimbursement for expenses from the [Workmen's] STATE WORKERS' Compensation Commission in accordance with the Standard State Travel Regulations.

(a) (1) The Injured Workers Rehabilitation Committee shall advise the [Workmen's] STATE WORKERS' Compensation Commission about the rehabilitation of each injured worker, whether or not the worker is eligible for [workmen's] WORKERS' compensation.
