## CHAPTER 22

(House Bill 759)

AN ACT concerning

### Charles County – Volunteer Firemen and Squadmen – Death Benefits

FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law in Charles County that direct the method of payment of certain death benefits of certain qualified volunteers to beneficiaries; requiring that a certain death benefit be paid when an unqualified volunteer fireman or squadman in Charles County is killed under certain circumstances; providing for the application of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to death benefits for volunteer firemen and squadmen in Charles County.

Article 9 – Public Local Laws of Maryland

(1988 Edition and September 1990 Supplement, as amended)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### Article 9 – Charles County

54-9.

~~G. (1) When a qualified volunteer dies, a death benefit of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.) shall be paid to the volunteer's designated beneficiary.~~

I. [In the event the qualified volunteer is not survived by a spouse, the benefits due that volunteer under this section shall be paid:

(1) To the designated beneficiary; or
