

herein shall retain as a fee of his office the present percentage of license revenues as authorized by law and the additional issuance fee now allowed and a further 3 percent of license revenues to be paid into the General Fund of the State to defray the expenses of the State License Bureau. All net proceeds received from the said licenses remaining after the deductions hereinabove authorized shall be paid by the said clerks to the incorporated town or city in which the licensed business or activity is located. Where the licensed business or activity is not located in an incorporated town or city, the net proceeds shall be paid to the county in which the licensed business or activity is located, provided however, that the provisions of this section shall be construed to apply only to licenses issued after June 30, 1947, and provided further, that this section, insofar as it relates to restaurants or eating places, shall not apply in Montgomery County.

The following positions shall not be included in the classified service:

(14) All registrars and librarians designated as holding faculty rank by the [respective boards of trustees of the State teachers' colleges,] BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF St. Mary's College, THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF Morgan State [College] UNIVERSITY and the BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE University of Maryland SYSTEM and the [business manager] VICE PRESIDENT FOR FINANCE AND MANAGEMENT at Morgan State [College] UNIVERSITY;
