(g) (4) If a disability beneficiary under the age of 50 is restored to active service and if the beneficiary's annual compensation then or at any time prior to the age of 50 is equal to or greater than the beneficiary's average final compensation at retirement, the retirement allowance shall cease, the beneficiary shall again become a member of the retirement system, and shall contribute thereafter at the rate applicable to the age at which the beneficiary paid prior to disability. Anything in this subtitle to the contrary notwithstanding, any prior service certificate on the basis of which service was computed at the time of retirement shall be restored to full force and effect, and in addition, upon the beneficiary's subsequent retirement the beneficiary shall be credited with all the service as a member creditable to the beneficiary at the time of retirement; but should the beneficiary be restored to membership after the attainment of age 45, the pension upon subsequent retirement may not exceed the pension which the beneficiary was receiving [immediate] IMMEDIATELY prior to the last restoration to membership before any reduction of such pension as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection and the pension that may have accrued as a new member on account of service since the last restoration to membership, provided that the total pension on the beneficiary's subsequent retirement may not exceed the rate percent the beneficiary would have received had the beneficiary remained in service during the period of prior retirement.
