- [(3)] (4) "Surviving spouse" means a person who has not remarried.
- [(4)] (5) "State or local public safety employee" means a person who is:
 - (i) A career or volunteer member of a:
 - 1. Fire department;
 - 2. Ambulance company or squad; or
 - 3. Rescue company or squad;
 - (ii) A law enforcement officer;
 - (iii) A correctional officer; or
- (iv) A member of the Maryland National Guard who was a resident of this State at the time of death.
- (d) A person may apply to the Administration for a scholarship under this section if the person:
- (1) Is the child of a member of the armed forces who was a resident of this State at the time the parent:
- (i) Died or was totally and permanently disabled as a result of military service after December 7, 1941; [or]
- (ii) Was declared to be a prisoner of war or missing in action, if that occurred on or after January 1, 1960 as a result of the Vietnam conflict, and if the child was born prior to or while the parent was a prisoner of war or missing in action; [or]
- (2) Was a prisoner of war on or after January 1, 1960 as a result of the Vietnam conflict and was a resident of this State at the time the person was declared to be a prisoner of war or missing in action; [or]
- (3) (i) Is a child of any State or local public safety employee killed in the line of duty; or
- (ii) Is the surviving spouse of any State or local public safety employee killed in the line of duty; OR
 - (4) IS A DISABLED PUBLIC SAFETY EMPLOYEE.
