(a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

(b) "Adult" means an individual who has attained the age of 21 years.

(c) ["Benefit plan" means an employer's plan for the benefit of an employee or partner.

(d)] "Broker" means a person lawfully engaged in the business of effecting transactions in securities or commodities for the person's own account or for the account of others.

[(e)] (D) "Conservator" means a person appointed or qualified by a court to act as general, limited, or temporary guardian of a minor's property or a person legally authorized to perform substantially the same functions.

[(f)] (E) "Court" means the circuit courts.

[(g)] (F) "Custodial property" means:

(1) Any interest in property transferred to a custodian under this subtitle;
and

(2) The income from and proceeds of that interest in property.

[(h)] (G) "Custodian" means a person so designated under § 13-309 of this subtitle or a successor or substitute custodian designated under § 13-318 of this subtitle.

[(i)] (H) "Financial institution" means a bank, trust company, savings institution, or credit union chartered and supervised under state or federal law.

[(j)] (I) "Legal representative" means an individual's personal representative or conservator.

[(k)] (J) "Member of the minor's family" means the minor's parent, stepparent, spouse, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, or aunt, whether of the whole or half blood or by adoption.
