(c) (1) In the event of an alleged sale or transfer as described in subsection (b) of this section, or in the event that a property is alleged to have ceased to be a "facility" as defined in this subtitle, the Secretary of the Board of Public Works may file, in the circuit court of the county or Baltimore City in which the property is located, a claim under this subtitle (styled as a civil action against the owner [or] OF the property and any other interested parties, including any transferor that the State wishes to make a party), together with a sworn affidavit stating facts on which the allegations of default are based, as well as a detailed justification of the amount claimed.

(d) (4) This lien may be enforced and foreclosed in accordance with the procedures prescribed in the Maryland Rules, except that neither [that] THE State nor any agent appointed by the State to sell the property need file a bond.
