

1. 1,000 HOURS OF ACTIVE NURSING PRACTICE WITHIN THE 5-YEAR PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE DATE OF RENEWAL;

2. A COURSE OF INSTRUCTION, COMMONLY KNOWN AS A REFRESHER COURSE, APPROVED BY THE BOARD; OR

3. A PRECEPTORSHIP PROGRAM PROVIDED BY AN EMPLOYER AND APPROVED BY THE BOARD.

(d) The applicant shall:

(1) (i) Have a baccalaureate or masters degree in health care administration from an accredited college or university; or

(ii) 1. Have a baccalaureate or masters degree in a field other than health care administration from an accredited college or university; and

2. Have satisfactorily completed a minimum of 100 hours in a course of study in health care administration, or its equivalent, approved by the Board; and

[(iii) 1.] (2) (I) Have completed an administrator-in-training program approved by the Board; or

[2.] (II) Have completed 1 year of full-time nursing home administration in a nursing home.
