3-104.

(h) To acquire, construct, reconstruct, rehabilitate, improve, [maintain] MAINTAIN, lease as lessor or as lessee, repair and operate projects within or without the State. The Service shall establish reasonable rules and regulations for the use of any project. It may acquire, purchase, hold, lease as lessee, and use any franchise and any property, real, personal or mixed, tangible or intangible, or any interest therein necessary to carry out the purposes of the Service. It may sell, lease as lessor, transfer, and dispose of any property or interest in it that it has acquired.

(a) A land trust [may] MAY, with the approval of the Trust, subsequently sell or transfer the acquired property to a third party.

3-903.

(a) There is hereby created a body politic and corporate to be known as the "Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority" which is constituted a public instrumentality of the State of Maryland. The exercise by the Authority of the powers conferred by this subtitle shall be deemed to be the performance of an essential public function. The Authority [shall be deemed] WAS organized and [shall commence] COMMENCED its activities ON OCTOBER 21, 1980, when there [shall have been] WERE filed with the Secretary of State and the Department of Legislative Reference certified copies of the resolutions of participation of at least two of the following four counties: Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, Baltimore County, Maryland, Anne Arundel County, Maryland, and Harford County, Maryland. Montgomery County, Maryland, [may] also [become] BECAME a participating county in the Authority by filing certified copies of a resolution of participation with the Secretary of State and the Department of Legislative Reference, whereupon Montgomery County, Maryland [shall have] HAD all of the rights, privileges, and powers under this subtitle that the other participating counties have or may have, including the power to participate in projects
