(ii) If the name of the secured party is not shown on an existing certificate of title issued by that jurisdiction, and if the law of that jurisdiction does not provide for certificates of title disclosing security interests, the security interest continues perfected in the State for 4 months and [also], after that time, if within the 4-month period the security interest is perfected in the State. This security interest may also be perfected in the State after the expiration of the 4-month period, in which case perfection dates from the time of perfection in the State.

(b) The assignee shall deliver to the Department the certificate of title if available and an assignment by the secured party named in the certificate of title in the form the Department may prescribe accompanied by a filing fee as required for perfection of the security interest under § 8–729 (b) of this subtitle. The assignee's security interest is perfected as of the time of its creation if delivery and payment to the Department are completed within 10 days of the date of its creation; otherwise, [perfection is determined] THE ASSIGNEE'S SECURITY INTEREST IS PERFECTED as of the time [of its delivery] THE ASSIGNEE DELIVERS THE CERTIFICATE and payment TO THE DEPARTMENT.

- (a) (2) (i) If by March 1, 1982 a flood management plan for Jones Falls is not prepared and approved and implementation begun under § 8–9A–03 of this title, the Department shall adopt regulations limiting construction, reconstruction, or changes in the course, current, or cross section of the channel and floodplain of the Jones Falls in the Patapsco River watershed until [a] SUCH time as a flood management plan for Jones Falls is prepared, approved, and implemented under Subtitle 9A of this title.
- (c) The Department, by regulation, may designate interjurisdictional watersheds in which any impoundment proposal is subject to review and approval by the Department for standards relating to safety and flood control. Gwynns Falls, Jones Falls, and Herring [Run] RUN, situated in or adjacent to Baltimore City are designated interjurisdictional watersheds.
