(i) (2) Any person desiring to erect a stationary blind or blind site in the waters of Talbot County first shall obtain a license in accordance with the following schedule of priorities:

(iii) [All owners] AN OWNER of riparian rights or the owner's lessees, licensees, or assignees, owning less than 500 contiguous yards of shoreline shall have priority to obtain a license for blind site between October 11 and 21 inclusive of each year, provided the owner or the owner's lessee, licensee, or assignee complies with the requirements of written consent; and

(5) If any licensee erects a stationary blind or blind site or sets a stake and the stationary blind, blind site, or stake is lost or destroyed in any manner beyond the licensee's control, the licensee may not lose the licensee's location but may reestablish the [location] STATIONARY BLIND, BLIND SITE, OR STAKE at any time during the current hunting season.

(b) If any licensee erects a stationary blind or blind site or sets a stake and the stationary blind, blind site, or stake is lost or destroyed in any manner beyond the licensee's control, the licensee may not lose the licensee's location but may reestablish the [location] STATIONARY BLIND, BLIND SITE, OR STAKE at any time during the current hunting season.

Stationary blinds or blind sites may not be erected, maintained or licensed in the following waters:

(1) Baltimore County: Middle River and its [tributaries and] TRIBUTARIES, westerly or towards shore from a straight line drawn from the tip of Wilson Point in a southwesterly direction to the northwest corner of Cape May beach; Frog Mortar Creek from a straight line drawn from the tip of what is known as Strawberry Point in a southeasterly direction across the creek to the tip of what is known as Galloway Point and extending 1500 yards northeast up the creek to the point where Glenwood Road approaches the creek shoreline; Back River and its tributaries west of the Eastern
