

(III) THE DIRECTOR OF THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL TRUST;

(IV) 2 MEMBERS REPRESENTING THE MARYLAND CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION;

(V) 1 MEMBER REPRESENTING THE MARYLAND MUNICIPAL LEAGUE;

(VI) 2 MEMBERS REPRESENTING THE MARYLAND WATERMEN'S ASSOCIATION; AND

(VII) 2 MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

(C) THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SHALL SELECT A CHAIRMAN FROM AMONG THEMSELVES.

(D) STAFF SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE AND THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL TRUST.

(E) THE COMMISSION SHALL:

(1) DEVELOP AN INVENTORY OF THE LOCATION AND CONDITION OF LIGHTHOUSES IN MARYLAND WATERS;

(2) DETERMINE THE KIND OF LIGHTHOUSES TO BE SAVED;

(3) DESIGNATE SPECIFIC LIGHTHOUSES TO BE SAVED;

(4) DETERMINE, WHERE NECESSARY, NEW SITES FOR LIGHTHOUSES;

(5) RECOMMEND, WHERE APPROPRIATE, REPLACEMENT OF SITE MARKERS WITH SCENIC STRUCTURES;

(6) CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY ON THE COST TO SAVE THE LIGHTHOUSES;

(7) INVESTIGATE SOURCES OF FINANCIAL AND OTHER ASSISTANCE THAT MAY BE AVAILABLE TO SAVE THE LIGHTHOUSES; AND

(8) PROMOTE A COOPERATIVE DIALOGUE WITH OTHER JURISDICTIONS TOWARD THE PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION OF LIGHTHOUSES ALONG THE ATLANTIC SEABOARD.

(F) THE COMMISSION SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, CONSISTENT WITH § 2-1312 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY BY JULY 1, 1991.

(G) ONCE THE COMMISSION ISSUES ITS REPORT, IT CEASES TO EXIST.
