- (III) THE DIRECTOR OF THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL TRUST;
- (IV) 2 MEMBERS REPRESENTING THE MARYLAND CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION;
- (V) 1 MEMBER REPRESENTING THE MARYLAND MUNICIPAL LEAGUE;
- (VI) 2 MEMBERS REPRESENTING THE MARYLAND WATERMEN'S ASSOCIATION; AND

(VII) 2 MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

- (C) THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SHALL SELECT A CHAIRMAN FROM AMONG THEMSELVES.
- (D) STAFF SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE AND THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL TRUST.
 - (E) THE COMMISSION SHALL:
- (1) DEVELOP AN INVENTORY OF THE LOCATION AND CONDITION OF LIGHTHOUSES IN MARYLAND WATERS;
 - (2) DETERMINE THE KIND OF LIGHTHOUSES TO BE SAVED:
 - (3) DESIGNATE SPECIFIC LIGHTHOUSES TO BE SAVED;
- (4) DETERMINE, WHERE NECESSARY, NEW SITES FOR LIGHTHOUSES;
- (5) RECOMMEND, WHERE APPROPRIATE, REPLACEMENT OF SITE MARKERS WITH SCENIC STRUCTURES;
- (6) CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY ON THE COST TO SAVE THE LIGHTHOUSES;
- (7) INVESTIGATE SOURCES OF FINANCIAL AND OTHER ASSISTANCE THAT MAY BE AVAILABLE TO SAVE THE LIGHTHOUSES; AND
- (8) PROMOTE A COOPERATIVE DIALOGUE WITH OTHER JURISDICTIONS TOWARD THE PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION OF LIGHTHOUSES ALONG THE ATLANTIC SEABOARD.
- (F) THE COMMISSION SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, CONSISTENT WITH § 2–1312 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY BY JULY 1, 1991.
- (G) ONCE THE COMMISSION ISSUES ITS REPORT, IT CEASES TO EXIST.
