

- 1. Formalized coordination among State and local government agencies;
- 2. Establishment of a clearinghouse for compiling information on streams, existing and potential impacts, and ongoing activities to protect and enhance stream quality;
- 3. Creation of a mechanism for prioritizing streams deserving attention;
- 4. Promotion of volunteer activities by private individuals and civic, environmental, and business organizations; and
- 5. Identification of specific management measures that could be adopted by State and local government agencies, including measures to control the cumulative impacts of growth and development.

(iii) Prepare a report summarizing its findings and recommendations.

(7) The Task Force shall submit its findings and recommendations to the Governor, the Governor's Commission on Growth in the Chesapeake Bay Region, and the General Assembly on or before September 1, 1990.]

**DRAFTER'S NOTE:**

This material repeals an inappropriately codified and several uncodified statutory commissions, committees, and task forces that are codified by other provisions of this Section.

**Chapter 6 of the Acts of the First Special Session of 1985**

[SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor, in consultation with the Speaker of the House of Delegates and the President of the Senate, shall appoint a special committee to study the effects of this Act on savings and loan associations with total assets of less than \$40,000,000 and make appropriate recommendations.]

**DRAFTER'S NOTE:**

This repeals an obsolete uncodified statutory committee of the General Assembly that was never appointed.
