SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publishers of the Annotated Code of Maryland, subject to the approval of the Director of the Department of Legislative Reference, shall make any changes in the text of the Annotated Code necessary to effectuate any termination provision that was enacted by the General Assembly and has taken effect or will take effect prior to October 1, 1991. Any enactment of the 1991 Session of the General Assembly that negates or extends the effect of a previously enacted termination provision shall prevail over the provisions of this section.

SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Drafter's Notes contained in this Act are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as part of this Act.

SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except for Sections 5, 6, 7, and 8 of this Act, the provisions of this Act are intended solely to correct technical errors in the law and that there is no intent to revive or otherwise affect law that is the subject of other acts, whether those acts were signed by the Governor prior to or after the signing of this Act.

SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except for Section 4 of this Act, this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.

SECTION 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 4 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

FOR the purpose of generally curing previous Acts of the General Assembly enacted with possible title of function paragraph defects; requiring certain rules and regulations required to be adopted by the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services, the Court of Appeals and the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals to include certain provisions governing the development of a fee schedule and the collection of fees for accessing criminal history records for other than criminal justice purposes; excepting Montgomery County from certain provisions of law relating to the time for applying for a dog license; prohibiting the Sheriff of Harford County from having outside employment; entitling certain hospitals to payment from the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene for certain services provided to a victim of alleged child sexual abuse; providing immunity from civil liability for certain
