other provision of State or local law, former Baltimore City Jail employees, while eligible for health insurance benefits as active State employees, may not receive retiree health insurance benefits from the City of Baltimore.

SECTION 5. 16. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publisher of the Annotated Code shall substitute all references to Baltimore City Jail with Baltimore City Detention Center in Article 27, §§ 11E(a), 410, and 700H of the Annotated Code.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That no part of this Act shall take effect until 30 days after the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services files with the Governor a written finding that any existing judicial decree, injunction, judgment, or other order affecting the Baltimore City Jail will not operate to materially impede the efficient operation of the Baltimore City Detention Center by State officials.

SECTION 7. 17. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any law or part of a law, public general or public local, and any <u>regulation or</u> provision of the Charter of Baltimore City inconsistent with this Act is superseded to the extent of the inconsistency.

SECTION 8. 18. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this Act, except for Section 4, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are declared severable.

SECTION 9. 19. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Article 41, §§ 4-102, 4-1401 through 4-1409, and 4-1413, as enacted herein and Section 9 and 14 of this Act, shall take effect June 1, 1991.

SECTION 10. 20. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Section 9 19 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.
