

- (I) THE NEEDS OF THE SCHOOLS OF THE STATE ARE MET;
- (II) THE REQUESTING PARTY DEMONSTRATES THE NEED FOR A SPECIMEN;
- (III) THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE REQUEST ARE THAT:
 - 1. NO OTHER SUFFICIENT SOURCE OF SPECIMENS WITHIN THE REQUESTING STATE EXISTS; OR
 - 2. A PREEXISTING ORGAN TISSUE DONATION WAS MADE BY AN INDIVIDUAL IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE UNIFORM DONOR ACT; AND
- (IV) THE REQUESTING PARTY BEARS THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR TRANSPORTING AND THE SPECIALIZED CARE OF THE SPECIMEN AND ALL ASSOCIATED COSTS.
- (V) THE BOARD RETAINS THE RIGHT OF EXCLUSIVE CONTROL OF THE SPECIMEN INCLUDING THE FINAL DISPOSITION WHEN APPROPRIATE OR NECESSARY TO FULFILL AN OBLIGATION TO RETURN THE REMAINS OF A DONATED SPECIMEN TO THE DONOR'S FAMILY.

(3) The Board may authorize a physician, teacher, demonstrator, or investigator of [anatomy] ADVANCED HUMAN BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES to send or transport human specimens out of [this] THE State for [use at a scientific or medical meeting, demonstration, or exhibit] USE BY MEDICAL STUDY PROGRAMS.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 69

(Senate Bill 30)

AN ACT concerning

Regional Institute for Children and Adolescents – Comparability

FOR the purpose of extending the period of time ~~for programmatic comparability of in which programs of and facilities for certain Regional Institutions~~ Institutes for Children and Adolescents shall be comparable; and requiring certain Regional Institutes for Children and Adolescents to report to the General Assembly by a certain date.
