**CHAPTER 82**

**(Senate Bill 76)**

AN ACT concerning

**Vehicle Laws – Abandoned Vehicles – Definition**

FOR the purpose of altering the definition of the term “abandoned vehicle” to include a vehicle that has been left unattended on any portion of a primary or secondary highway or controlled access highway and is in violation of certain provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law relating to certain disabled vehicles, thereby authorizing a police department to take the vehicle into custody; ~~and~~ making stylistic changes; and generally relating to including certain unattended disabled vehicles within a definition of “abandoned vehicle” under certain circumstances.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article – Transportation**

(a) Whenever any truck, passenger bus, truck tractor, trailer, semitrailer, or pole trailer, or any motor vehicle towing a mobile home is disabled on the roadway or shoulder of any highway outside of any municipal corporation at any time when lighted lamps are
